The State of Delaware conducted a one-year mail-in rebate program to help residents replace older, inefficient appliances with new, ENERGY STAR[®] qualified models. **Over 9,400 rebates were paid to Delaware residents, representing total energy savings to the state of 11 billion Btu.** This is enough energy to heat the University of Delaware campus in winter for one week.

DELAWARE AT A GLANCE

- Fourteen products received rebates ranging from \$25 to \$550.
- Clothes washer and dishwasher sales will reduce Delaware's annual water consumption by over 30 million gallons.
- Delaware received \$838,000 from the federal government to implement the program. Of this funding amount, 99.7 percent went directly to rebates.
- The state covered administrative costs with \$206,374 of its own funds.
